Context challenges	Beechworth Secondary College is a rural school in the north-east of Victoria, approximately 284 kilometres from Melbourne. The school was established in 1959. Enrolments are approximately 240 students in 2018. School facilities comprise of a number of buildings with classrooms, teacher resource rooms, art and science rooms and a library. There is a Trade Training Vocational Education (VET) Auto facility, and a wood work room used for VET Furniture or Building and Construction. There is a Community Recreation Centre gym on site as a shared facility. Two buildings have been completed as part of the ongoing building program, built in 2010, with the remaining buildings planned for replacement in the second stage of the building program. The next stage expected to begin in 2019. The school curriculum reflects the Victorian Curriculum, and students in years 7 to 9 can choose to enrol in the Montessori Adolescent Program (MAP). The school music program was re-established in 2018 along with a newly formed, Creative and Performing Arts Program. Beechworth SC is closely linked with programs through the Bogong Outdoor school at years 7, 9 and 10. Students from year 9 have also joined the Alpine School for Leadership program in China for 2018 and will also be attending in 2019. We offer VCE, VET and VCAL courses. Beechworth SC has links with community service programs, local health providers such as Beechworth Health Services, Headspace and Landcare. The staffing profile consists of a Principal, an Assistant Principal, LT Teaching & Learning and the full time equivalent of 26.8 teaching staff. There are the equivalent to 6 full time administrative and ES. Key challenges are the review of the whole school curriculum and structure, as we work to develop the most viable solution to small numbers and the need to cater to a wide choice for VCE subjects, and to continue to build college enrolments.

Intent, rationale and focus

Focus – A viable, whole school curriculum and structure that caters for a small senior cohort.

The focus for this Strategic Plan Strategic Plan is on improving school performance and student outcomes, as recommended through our Peer Review.

Our key goal aligned to the FISO is to achieve excellence in teaching and learning to maximise student learning outcomes, through

- establishing a guaranteed and viable curriculum through consistent planning and assessment practices;
- developing, documenting and monitoring the use of student assessment data to inform the provision of targeted learning for all students;
- and developing and monitoring the implementation of consistent and sustained high impact teaching strategies, evaluated against the impact of learning.

A further area of focus aligns to the FISO priority area of professional leadership to enhance professional capability to lead and implement change to improve student learning.

Key strategies to achieve this goal is for the school to;

- build professional learning teams to lead school improvement;
- establish a culture of review, responsibility and shared accountability for school improvement;
- establishing a clear whole school vision and values; and
- ensuring accountability requirements.

A further area of focus is on the student wellbeing and engagement FISO of empowering students to build school pride, to build learning communities. The aim is;

- to build higher levels of school pride and connectedness shared by teachers, students, parents and the broader community;
- implementing authentic student voice opportunities to collaborate and make decisions, impact on the design and implementation of school programs and policy, and actively contribute ideas about student-led learning opportunities; and
- establish and maintain authentic learning partnerships with the wider Beechworth community.

By extending our work across the wider community, and linking the school with support services and student engagement and leaning opportunities beyond the school, we strive to build stronger relationships and connectedness and improve student wellbeing outcomes.
